<b>Tree survival rate and responsibility</b>	Vendors should strive towards an 80% tree survival rate at households. This will involve follow-up support and monitoring in collaboration with local partners. While we understand that factors beyond the vendor's control may affect survival rates, we expect proactive measures to maximise tree longevity.
<b>Distribution points and size</b>	It is anticipated there will be several distribution points. A minimum of three main distribution points is expected, each requiring around 200m <sup>2</sup> . Based on the delivery schedule, we invite to vendor recommendations for distribution and site sizes.
<b>Number of local partners</b>	The project is working with Alexandra Water Warriors, a local partner based in Alexandra. Labour in the form of 25 community representatives will be supplied via the local partner. This will include carrying out the distribution and monitoring of trees at households.
<b>Payment for local partners and community representatives</b>	The services of local partners and community representatives will be covered by the project budget. The project also has an employment component as part of its goal to empower local communities, including training and capacity-building.
<b>Grant or donation raising</b>	The note refers to potential additional funding to enhance the project's impact. Vendors or partners who can secure additional funding or in-kind support will be looked upon favourably.
<b>Adding indigenous trees to the list</b>	Vendors may suggest indigenous species better suited to the Johannesburg climate that can withstand frost. Any species that align with the project's ecological restoration goals are welcome for consideration, subject to the approval of Johannesburg Parks and Zoo.
<b>Frost-sensitive fruit trees</b>	Vendors may include frost covers in their pricing for sensitive species like avocado and cost separately therefore. However, vendors may also suggest substituting frost-sensitive trees with hardier varieties better suited to the Highveld climate.
<b>Extension of tender submission deadline</b>	Yes, JICP will be extending the deadline to Monday, 21 October 2024, 17:00 PM.
<b>Timing for deciduous fruit trees</b>	This does not form part of the RFP.
<b>Space for office and security</b>	The local partner is responsible for providing space and security for tree related activities.
